
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Location No. 1  
Hiram Gove Farm Cemetery  
Rt. 1 and Rt. 190

This cemetery is in the woods behind the Wabanaki Mall at the junction of Rt. 1 and Rt. 190. When in the cemetery and looking toward Rt. 1, the Perry Farmers Union can be seen. This cemetery is very difficult to find and is not well maintained.

From the Junction of Rt. 1 and Rt. 190, proceed north 0.3 miles to Shore Rd. Turn right onto Shore Rd. and proceed 0.25 miles to Gleason Rd. Turn right onto Gleason Rd. and proceed 0.2 miles to the cemetery which is in the woods on the right side of Gleason Rd. This cemetery would be difficult to find without a knowledgeable guide.

From the junction of Rt. 1 and Rt. 190 proceed 0.3 miles north on Rt. 1 to Shore Rd. Turn right onto Shore Rd. and proceed 0.25 miles to Gleason Rd. Turn right onto Gleason Rd. and proceed 0.3 miles to the cemetery which is on the left side of Gleason Rd. The stones can be seen from the road, but during the summer the area tends to become overgrown with ferns.

Turn right onto Shore Rd. and proceed 1.9 miles north on Shore Rd. to the cemetery which is on the left side of Shore Rd. There is a dirt road located beside a driveway that leads to the cemetery. A "Bayview Cemetery" sign over the gate into the cemetery can be seen from Shore Rd. high on the hillside.

One middle-aged male slave, however, for reasons unknown, stayed on and worked on the farm, about 100 feet west of the present-day Methodist Church. I am not sure if there ever was a gravestone, but if so it has undoubtedly disappeared or become overgrown. Unfortunately all of my family’s records and diaries were destroyed in a fire so I know of nothing in writing concerning this gravesite. I remember discussing this matter with my grandfather and other family members, and they all believed the story was true.”
